



A Service Enterprise is an organization that strategically leverages volunteers to achieve operational efficiency and more significant social impacts. "Through the dedicated efforts of volunteers, our organization significantly enhances its ability to fulfill its mission. Volunteers serve as a driving force behind our initiatives, bringing passion, diverse skills, and a sense of community engagement. Their invaluable contributions amplify our impact, allowing us to reach more individuals, overcome challenges, and implement programs with greater efficiency and effectiveness. The collaborative spirit of our volunteers not only strengthens our organizational capacity but also fosters a deeper connection with the communities we serve, creating a positive ripple effect that extends far beyond the immediate goals of our mission. In essence, volunteers play a pivotal role in propelling our organization towards the realization of its overarching objectives, creating a lasting and meaningful impact." - Crystal Noles, Director.

Research conducted by the TCC Group, a national program and evaluation firm, found that organizations operating as Service Enterprises outperform peer organizations on all aspects of organizational effectiveness and are more adaptable, sustainable, and capable of scaling their work. 80% of Service Enterprise organizations report increased volunteer and skill-based volunteers. The Service Enterprise program is a national change management program that helps organizations gain a greater return on volunteer investment to better achieve their mission.

COMMISSIONER CAROLYN CAMPBELL AND OTHERS PLAN REMEMBRANCE FOR THE 70th ANNIVERSARY OF BROWN V. BOARD OF EDUCATION

2024 marks the 70th anniversary of Brown v. Board, which was a Supreme Court decision that declared state laws establishing separate public schools for black and white students to be unconstitutional.

Recently, Arts Connect Topeka convened a planning committee of adults who attended public schools during that time, including Commissioner Carolyn Campbell (pictured above). Carolyn shared that she attended McKinley Elementary School in North Topeka from kindergarten through 6th grade.

The Brown v. Board 70th Anniversary Homecoming Celebration is planned for "May 18, 2024. As they commemorate this historic occasion, they invite you to be a part of the festivities that honor the legacy of Brown v. Board and reflect on the progress made in the pursuit of educational equality.
